# **Council Project Updates**

### CROWDHILL DEVELOPMENT

Residents might be aware that when the Council first sent out the play area design brief to play contractors, a large number of them had full order books and were already at their limit in respect to taking on more projects and therefore were not able meet the Council's deadlines.

Subsequently, as is our normal practice, the Council was not able to give the community a huge choice of designs to view and vote on. Reading residents' comments on the one design shown, it was decided through a straw poll, to ask residents if they would rather we revisited the design brief taking on board comments and ideas thus delaying installation until the Spring Or to plough ahead regardless.

The poll came back overwhelmingly that residents would rather a further delay in order to give them more choice.

We are therefore re-submitting the play area design tender due to include comments from residents including adding more play value by not having sculptural items and equipment for the junior age children up to IO/II years old as well the toddler ages. This will be sent to play contractors shortly and we hope to be able to present a number of design options to residents in October.

We will regularly update residents via our facebook page on the progress of this project.





#### SPLASHPAD PROGRESS

Residents will have seen that the main splashpad area including artificial grass, fencing and gates has been completed. As there are a number of outstanding issues which we need to address including groundworks to the surrounding area, before we can safely open the splashpad, we will not be able to open the splashpad for this season. We do however hope to open early next season to coincide with the opening of the community café.



The Council is currently completing pre-contract questions with our appointed contractor. Once these are completed, we hope that work on the site will commence in the next few weeks. We will keep residents up-to-date on the progress of this project on our social media pages.

#### #BeSafeBeSound Campaign

Counter Terrorism Policing is working with music venues and UK festivals to help people enjoy their live events safely this summer.

Their advice for anyone attending an event this summer:

- If you spot something that doesn't feel right, report it to police or to security staff immediately: don't leave it to someone else.
- Don't leave bags unattended or anywhere they could cause a security scare. Never agree to look after anyone else's bags, no matter how genuine they seem.
- ☐ If you see something on social media that concerns you, report it.
- □ In an emergency, if you think there is an immediate risk, always call 999 and look around you for help from staff especially those with radios who can raise the alarm quickly.
- ☐ If there is an incident, listen to staff and any announcements.

To report annonymously, call the Coastal Crime Line powered by Crimestoppers on 0000 01 3304. In an emergency, always call 999.

Crimestoppers works with <u>Project Kraken</u>, <u>Project</u>

<u>Falco</u> and <u>Border Force</u>, and powers the <u>Coastal Crime Line</u>, giving you a way to report any information or suspicions 100% anonymously. If you don't feel comfortable reporting to the police you can call the Costal Crime Line free on 0800 011 3304 or report it online 24/7 on their website.

Whether you're a keen sailor, work in the maritime industry or are simply enjoying a coastal walk – if you see something suspicious, the Coastal Crime Line is here for you.

#### Social Media – 4 top tips for parents & carers from CEOP

## 1 Is your child ready for social media?

Most social media platforms require users to be over the age of 13. Does your child have the social and emotional skills to manage an online profile?



#### 2 Be a good role model

What you do on social media matters. Check your friendships, posts and privacy settings. Ask permission from your child to post pictures of them.



# 3 Privacy and security settings.

Go through your child's privacy and security settings with them. Talk about who can see their profiles, posts and videos.



# 4 Talk about how to get support.

Talk about what they can do if anything on social media makes them feel worried or uncomfortable. Make sure they know they can always talk to you.
